We're striking to make Kaiser fix its mental healthcare system

Kaiser Permanente was forced to pay \$200 million last October for violating the rights of its patients to mental health care that met their needs. But one year later, Kaiser has no state-approved plan to fix its system and the core problems remain unsolved:

- We're still severely understaffed, which leaves patients unable to get timely, appropriate care within the Kaiser system.
- We don't get enough time for important patient care duties that can't be done during appointments, like returning phone calls and devising individual treatment plans. This causes burnout and worsens understaffing.
- As mental health professionals, we're singled out for much lower salaries and poorer benefits than other Kaiser caregivers, which forces many of us to leave Kaiser, disrupting patient care.

We want Kaiser to offer mental health care that is as good as its medical care. And we're sick of Kaiser paying fines instead of fixing its mental healthcare system while patients suffer.
